Regularisation of the Use of Central Harbour Transit by Cruise Ships

Purpose

This paper seeks members’ support on regularising the arrangement on the use of Central Fairway, Northern Fairway and Western Fairway (collectively referred to as Central Harbour Transit (“CHT”)) by specified types of cruise ships¹ berthing at the Kai Tak Cruise Terminal (“KTCT”) during the period between 18:00 and 06:00 the next day daily starting from 4 March 2026.

Background

2. Having consulted the four relevant consultative committees² under Marine Department (“MD”), a trial scheme was introduced in March 2024 for 24 months (i.e. until 3 March 2026) to allow specified types of cruise ships berthing at the KTCT to transit through the CHT during designated hours without the need of prior approval from the Vessel Traffic Centre (“VTC”) of MD. The initial transit window was set between 19:00 and 22:00. To better align with cruise ship operations and having considered the harbour marine traffic flow, MD has consulted the four committees in October 2024 to extend the transit window of the trial scheme to 18:00 to 06:00 the next day. With members’ support, the extended transit window of the scheme became effective on 18 November 2024.

Proposed Regularisation

3. Victoria Harbour has all along been one of the key iconic tourist attractions of Hong Kong. The current trial scheme was put in place with a view to boosting the development of cruise tourism by leveraging on the beautiful scenery of Victoria Harbour. In fact, we have received very positive feedback from cruise passengers onboard cruises that were permitted to transit through the CHT even before launching of the trial scheme. Moreover, locals and tourists on both sides of Victoria Harbour were able to appreciate the view of international cruise ships sailing through the harbour, thereby enriching the night scenery of Victoria Harbour.

4. In December 2024, the Government promulgated the “Action Plan on Development of Cruise Tourism” (Action Plan) alongside the “Development Blueprint for Hong Kong’s Tourism Industry 2.0”. One of the action measures in the Action Plan is to regularise the Central Fairway transit arrangement for cruise ships berthing at KTCT subject smooth implementation of the trial scheme.

5. The trial scheme was welcomed by the cruise industry. A number of cruise lines expressed interest and made enquiries on the arrangement. Although the actual usage was low³ as the actual implementation hinged on a number of factors, including tidal condition, and actual departure time, the operation was smooth without significant impact to marine traffic. With the regularisation of the arrangement, we expect that more cruise ships would benefit from it which will also further enhance the attractiveness of Hong Kong as a cruise destination.

On balance with marine traffic impact and navigational risks, it is proposed to maintain the current transit window, i.e. from 18:00 to 06:00 the next day, and for the current specified types of cruise ships berthing at KTCT. It should also be noted that the arrangement is applicable only to cruise ships berthing at KTCT and those berthing at the Ocean Terminal are excluded. For cruise ships intending to use CHT outside the transit window or not belonging to the specified types of cruise ships, the ships are still required to apply to VTC for permission on a case-by-case basis in accordance with the existing practice. Proposed updates for the current Berthing Guidelines are at *Annex* to reflect the regularisation. Moreover, all other conditions currently under the trial scheme remain valid and shall be followed by relevant stakeholders.

Way Forward

7. Subject to members' support, the proposed regularisation of the arrangement will take effect from 4 March 2026. The Tourism Commission (TC) and MD will continue to monitor the implementation of the regularised arrangement and make adjustments as necessary based on feedback from stakeholders and actual operational conditions. In case of any significant change of marine traffic along the CHT, consideration could be given to suspend the arrangement. Separately, TC will continue to work with the Hong Kong Tourism Board and other stakeholders to promote the arrangement to cruise lines.

Advice Sought
