To: All CSO of HK registered ships

Detention of Hong Kong registered ship in US port on LRIT deficiency

In a recent Port State Control (PSC) inspection in a U.S. port, a Hong Kong registered

ship was detained because it did not have evidence of LRIT compliance in the form of a

Conformance Test Report (CTR), despite the fact that the ship's Classification Society

issued recently a new Cargo Ship Safety Equipment Certificate which was endorsed as

"Fitted" for LRIT as required by MSC.1/CIRC.1307.

CSOs' attention is drawn that the U.S. may detain foreign flagged vessel in U.S. ports

for failure to have a CTR and for failure to transmit (or ability to transmit)".

When ships are sailing to US port, the Master should ensure that the ships required to

comply with LRIT requirement are provided with a CTR ready for PSC inspection.

He should also ensure that the LRIT equipment is switched on for operation.

Shipowners are reminded of the circular letters of 8 July 2009 and 16 October 2009

regarding other measures to be taken to avoid detention during Port State Control

inspection in foreign ports.
