(Marine Industrial Accident)

Safe Handling of Cargo At Sea

A local dumb steel lighter used its derrick crane to transfer steel

sheet coils from an ocean going vessel to a Chinese registered river trade vessel.

During cargo operation, the slewing wire of the derrick crane was parted. It

caused the steel sheet coils to swing suddenly and hit at a sailor working on

board the river trade vessel. The sailor was certified dead in the hospital.

2. The investigation into the accident revealed the parted slewing wire

was in lack of maintenance and lubrication and thus had deteriorated to a point

at which the wire yielded prematurely and parted during cargo operation.

3. To avoid recurrence of similar accidents, the attention of owners,

masters and persons-in-charge of all vessels are drawn to the following

important advice: -

To ensure all wire ropes used are maintained and lubricated

regularly and properly; and

To ensure all wire ropes are inspected by competent persons as

required by the Merchant Shipping (Local Vessels)(Works)

Regulations.
